At the time of **abstract submission**, authors must select **one** publication outlet (Special Issue of *JUMP*, Literary Voice, Literature & Aesthetics, the Palgrave/Springer edited volume, or other designated journal/book).

- ◆ **This choice is final.** Once an abstract is accepted, the corresponding full paper will be processed **only** for the selected journal or book.
- ◆ Papers will not be transferred between publication outlets after submission.
- ◆ Authors are encouraged to review each outlet's scope and requirements carefully before making their selection.

Abstract Submission

Authors are required to submit their abstract in both MS Word and PDF format, following the criteria below:

Required Contents:

- Title
- Author's Name(s) & Affiliation(s)
- Abstract & Keywords
- Chosen Publication Outlet (Theme 1–4)

Formatting Instructions:

- Abstract Length: Maximum 300 words
- Font: Times New Roman

- **Title: 15 pt (Bold, Centered)**
- **Author's Name(s): 14 pt (Centered)**
- **Affiliation(s): 13 pt (Centered)**
- **Abstract & Keywords Heading: 13 pt (Bold)**
- **Abstract Body & Keywords: 12 pt (Not Italic)**
- **Line Spacing: 1.5**
- **Abstract Alignment: Justified**
- **Abstract Paragraph: Single, No Indentation**
- **Keywords: Maximum 6, listed in alphabetical order, separated by semicolons, and not included in the title.**

Submission Policy:

- **Each abstract must clearly indicate ONE publication outlet (Theme 1–4). This selection is final.**
- **Abstracts and full papers will be subject to double-blind peer review.**
- **Only registered papers and listed authors will be invited to submit full manuscripts; no author additions after registration.**
